• Participate in all scheduled and assigned training classes.

• Assist in providing firefighting, rescue, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) services, and basic life support at emergency scenes.

• Participate in the exchange of information between other members and in meetings as necessary.

• Check all personal gear to ensure safe and effective operation.

• Respond to alarms of fires or other emergencies. Assist with the use of hoses and nozzles to direct fog or water stream; raise and climb ladders; use fire extinguishers, bars, hooks, lines, pike poles, halogens, drills, saws, extrication tools and appliances, and other equipment safely, efficiently, and in accordance with established policies and procedures.

Maintain familiarity with maps and related road networks within the Town of Lebanon

and within those areas with automatic mutual aid response agreements.

• Communicate among other personnel, upper management and the general public as necessitated by the position.
